New business coming to our Area

The Mayor and Tucson City Council gave final approval to the **Primary Jobs Incentive and Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT)** incentives for **HomeGoods**, paving the way for the Massachusetts-based company to establish a new West Coast distribution center in Tucson. The company says it would eventually create 910 jobs in 15 years (more than 400 in the first year) at a property near the airport. HomeGoods expects to begin construction in May and open the facility next year.
